Judiciary Launches Guardianship Video Series

(Hagåtña, Guam) — Navigating the guardianship process can be overwhelming, especially for families facing difficult decisions about the care of a loved one. To help bridge that gap, the Judiciary of Guam has launched a new educational video series designed to demystify guardianship and empower the community with clear, accessible information.

Developed in collaboration with the Office of the Public Guardian (OPG) and launched in recognition of Guardianship Awareness Month this October, this initiative provides essential guidance for prospective guardians, elder care and disability professionals, and anyone seeking to understand how the courts protect those unable to advocate for themselves.

This project was supported by the Administration for Community Living (ACL), U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS), as part of a financial assistance award totaling \$410,206, with 100 percent funding provided by ACL/HHS.
