(a) Eligibility. An attorney who is currently admitted to practice law in the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands (CNMI) by examination and who is in good standing in the CNMI may apply for admission to the Guam Bar by reciprocity under this Rule, provided the applicant is not subject to pending disciplinary charges in any jurisdiction and is otherwise eligible for admission under these Rules.

1 (b) Application; required materials. An applicant seeking admission by reciprocity under this
2 Rule shall submit to the Clerk of the Supreme Court of Guam: (1) a completed "Application for
3 Reciprocal Admission to the Guam Bar"; (2) an original or certified Certificate of Good Standing
4 issued by the CNMI not more than 30 days before the date of the application; (3) original or
5 certified Certificates of Good Standing from any other jurisdiction in which the applicant has
6 been admitted to practice, each issued not more than 30 days before the date of the application;
7 (4) "Attestation of Familiarity with Guam Rules and Authorities," and (5) any additional
8 information or documentation the court may reasonably require to determine eligibility.

9 (c) Fee. The application fee for admission by reciprocity under this Rule is fifty dollars (\$50.00),
10 payable to the Supreme Court of Guam at the time of filing the Application for Reciprocal
11 Admission.

12 (d) Investigation and determination. The court may inquire into the applicant's disciplinary
13 history and may require further documentation, testimony, or a hearing. The court may deny,
14 condition, or grant admission based on its determination.

15 (e) Oath and admission. Upon approval of the application and payment of all required fees, the
16 applicant shall take the oath prescribed by law and shall be admitted to the practice of law in
17 Guam upon duly registering with the Guam Bar Association.
